

Our major fund raiser each year is the Whale Watch and we are making slow, but steady, progress toward achieving our goal to fund three scholarships for students at UH Maui College. If we sell all seats on the boat we will add a net of \$4000 to the Endowment Fund. Presently, ticket sales total \$3640 plus an additional \$270 brought in by the recent Antiques Faire. This leaves \$2710 (77.4 tickets!) to raise after paying for the boat – the only expense. It's such a fun event and the cause is very worthwhile, so please go out and sell, sell, sell.


