

AAUW SUPPORTS WOMEN'S MARCH ON WASHINGTON

The 58th Presidential Inauguration will take place in Washington, D.C. on January 20, 2017. On the following day, activists will rally across the country to send a vital message: **women's rights are human rights**. At the national and state level, AAUW is giving support to the Women's March and will have an official delegation right in front of the U.S. Capitol.

AAUW-HI is also planning a Women's March on Oahu which would take place on Saturday, January 21st in downtown Honolulu. The following is a quote from the Honolulu "Women's March on Washington" Supporting Group Application.

"In the spirit of democracy and honoring the champions of human rights, dignity and justice who have come before us, we join in diversity to show our presence in numbers too great to ignore. The Women's March on Washington will send a bold message to our new administration on their first day in office, and to the world that women's rights are human rights. We stand together, recognizing that defending the most marginalized among us is defending all of us."


