TOPIC: THE MISSION OF NĀ HOALOHA SPEAKER: Monnie Gay Nā Hoaloha was founded in 1995 by Sister Roselani Enomoto to help homebound kupuna and persons with disabilities to age in place instead of an institution and to increase their quality of life. Nā Hoaloha provides compassionate care to seniors and persons with disabilities to help them remain independent. This award-winning organization continues to grow at an extraordinary rate, providing new programs and support for our kupuna and those with disabilities. Their clients are typically frail elders who want to remain in their homes but need assistance. The programs which have been developed over the years deal with the practical by providing transportation to the doctors or shopping, or by providing assessments of homes to reduce the chance of falling, one of the largest killers of seniors in Hawai'i. All programs are free and provided through our wonderful volunteers.

Monnie Gay has owned numerous businesses, including Management Search and Consulting, the Computer Expo (both on Oahu), Kelly Consulting and Aloha Sun Botanicals on Maui. She has worked for the Office of Economic Development at the County of Maui, and has been the recruiting & placement coordinator for Hawaii Job Corps. Monnie has served on the Board of Directors of Na Hoaloha for over six years and presently serves as a board community advisor.
