AAUW Diversity and Inclusion Initiative

The Diversity and Inclusion Committee is new both at the national and branch level. However, diversity is not new. This is not an easy challenge or quick fix solution, however aauw.org offers resources. The primary purpose is inclusiveness at an organizational capacity to include various underrepresented groups. A recent survey indicated 79% of women were underrepresented for leadership and promotions followed by: age over 50 at 46%; ethnicities at 39% at the organizational and corporate level.
