Speaker Meeting August 22

The August Speaker Meeting will be held on **Saturday, August 22, via Zoom. There will be a social half-hour starting at 10 a.m., then the business meeting at 10:30 a.m. followed by our speaker.** The Zoom log-in information will be emailed to members by Cathy Thompson prior to the meeting.

Our speaker will be **Robert Martin** (Linda Martin's husband.) Robert will be giving a presentation on *Stamp Collecting: Famous U.S. Women*, and will discuss distinguished women on U.S. stamps, including women involved with the passage of the 19th Amendment.

Robert began collecting stamps as a child, and now has been collecting for over 62 years. He has a near-complete collection of all major variety U.S. stamps and the world's largest collection of U.S. Railroad perfins. (Robert will explain what a "perfin" is during his talk.) For the past 18 years, Robert has run free stamp collecting clubs



for children in grades 1-6 in public elementary schools. He has given to children over 5,000 stamp albums and is approaching having given away over 1 million stamps. Stamp club is held at lunch recess and has always been a huge success.

Robert has presented many speeches on various aspects of stamp collecting, and has written over 100 articles, as well as two books (not yet published). He also maintains a website for youth and beginner stamp collectors at www.stampcollectingclubsforkids.org. He is a member of the Royal Philatelic Society London and a Life member of the American Philatelic Society.

Book Group August 1



The book for August is *The Great Alone*, by Christine Hannah

Alaska, 1974. Ernt Allbright came home from the Vietnam War a changed and volatile man. When he loses yet another job, he makes the impulsive decision to move his wife and daughter north where they will live off the grid in America's last true frontier. But as winter approaches and darkness descends, Ernt's fragile mental state deteriorates. Soon the perils outside pale in comparison to threats from within. In their small cabin, covered in snow, blanketed in 18 hours of night, Leni and her mother learn the terrible truth: they are on their own.



September's book will be The Goldfinch: A Novel, by Donna Tartt.

Theo Decker, a 13 year-old New Yorker, miraculously survives an accident that kills his mother. Abandoned by his father, Theo is taken in by the family of a wealthy friend. Bewildered by his strange new home on Park Avenue, disturbed by schoolmates who don't know how to talk to him, and tormented above all by a longing for his mother, he clings to the one thing that reminds him of her: a small, mysteriously captivating painting that ultimately draws Theo into a wealthy and insular art community. As an adult, Theo moves between the drawing rooms of the rich and the dusty labyrinth of an antiques store where he works. He is at the center of a narrowing, ever more dangerous circle.


Preserving Branch Records

The AAUW State Public Policy committee has been very active during this election year. Our branch member representative is Janet Walker.

The Guide also includes Hawaii voter registration information and deadlines.

The AAUW state organization asked each branch to prioritize three top issues for the state. Those chosen by the Maui branch were:

- Wage Discrimination: clarifying and prohibiting, including requiring employers to disclose wage ranges to employees;
- 2) Workplace Sexual Harassment: prohibiting non-disclosure agreements as employment requirements and prohibiting retaliation for reporting harassment; and
- 3) Gender Parity: parity of representation on state boards and commissions.

AAUW's National Priorities for 2020-2021 are:

- Removing Bias from Education;
- 2) Fighting for Fair Play and Economic Equity; and
- 3) Advancing Women in Leadership.


