PUBLIC POLICY: WHAT ABOUT TITLE X?

We are all fairly familiar with Title IX, the federal civil rights law enacted to prevent discrimination in education. But what about Title X? Title X was enacted in 1970 and is the only federal program specifically directed to provide affordable, voluntary, confidential and patient-centered birth control and reproductive health care to people with low incomes who could not otherwise afford it. Currently, health care providers receiving Title X federal funding can provide a full range of care and services, including birth control and medical exams, and cancer screenings such as breast exams, and HIV testing. They can give pregnant patients non-directive information and counseling about their three options: parenting, adoption or abortion. Title X funds are not used to provide abortions, but clinics receiving Title X funds can at the request of a patient refer her to a qualified abortion provider.

The Trump administration has issued new proposed regulations that would: (1) block payment of federal funds for any and all services to providers/clinics that provide abortions or information about abortions (such as Planned Parenthood); (2) prohibit counseling and referral to abortion services even if the patient requests it or if her health depends upon these services. Only information on prenatal care, delivery, adoption and infant or foster care may be given; (3) direct new funds to faith-based and other organizations that promote fertility awareness and abstinence as methods of family planning. Additionally, the Department of Health and Human Services is creating a new division to protect health care workers who refuse to provide treatment to certain people because of their personal moral or religious objections. Also included is the proviso that any institution providing abortions, such as a hospital, must maintain a physically separate facility with separate staff, entrances and exits and separate record-keeping.

In the light of these proposed changes, it is significant to note the Institute of Medicine's landmark study on health care which identified six domains which must be present for quality care: safety, timeliness, patient-centeredness, effectiveness, efficiency and equity. All of these domains would be adversely affected by this new proposal. If fully implemented the proposed changes to Title X would shrink the network of participating providers and have major repercussions for access for low income women and teenagers across the country who rely upon them for health care.



A Piece of the World is a story about the burdens and blessings of family history, and how an artist and a muse can come together to forge a new and timeless legacy. To Christina Olson, the entire world was her family's remote farm in the small coastal town of Cushing, Maine. Born in the home her family had lived in for generations, and increasingly incapacitated by illness, Christina seemed destined for a small life. Instead, for more than 20 years, she was host and inspiration for the artist Andrew Wyeth, and became the subject of one of the best known American paintings of the 20th century.



AAUW MEMBERSHIP DUES

This means the National, State and Maui dues must be sent to National and then they will transfer the State and Maui portions to the Hawaii State treasurer and the Maui treasurer.

Each individual member can send their dues directly to National or to our branch treasurer, Pat Gotschalk, but in each case all three dues portions must be together. The branch treasurer will send any dues received from branch members to National for processing.

It's easy for members to submit their dues on line using a credit card. Once again, if you do this, send all three dues portions together (National + State + Maui).


