I was very excited to receive three reports from UH Maui College itemizing the Maui Branch scholarship donations under our three scholarships. Since the time that the first scholarship was established in 1994, the Maui branch has funded 67 scholarship awards to 58 students for a total amount of \$81,796! This is so impressive, and we should all be gratified and proud to reflect on how these scholarships helped improve the lives of our Maui 'ohana. Adding to this amount, this year we were able to donate \$3,500 for each of our three scholarships.

Speaker Meeting, Saturday, April 23 Speaker: Sandy Ma - "Common Cause Hawaii"

The April speaker will be Sandy Ma. Sandy is the Executive Director of Common Cause Hawaii.

As the Executive Director, Sandy leads campaigns, fundraising, and engages local, state, and national organizations in building coalitions around Hawaii, focusing on ethics and accountability, money and influence, and voting and elections.

Sandy comes to the organization with a broad range of nonprofit, corporate, and government experience. She previously was an ACLU attorney in North Carolina and Hawaii. She was a private practice attorney for several years. She most recently worked with the Hawaii Office of Planning in the Coastal Zone Management Program, focusing on climate change, sea level rise, and coastal hazard issues.



Sandy will be discussing the various voting laws in Hawaii. Hawaii has adopted many laws to modernize voting and elections:

- In 1993, 16 and 17 year olds were allowed to preregister to vote if you can show that you will be 18 by the next election.
- In 2012, statewide online voter registration was adopted and implemented in 2015.
- In 2015, same-day voter registration was enacted (and phased in) to allow people to register to vote on the same day they cast their ballot.
- In 2019, Hawaii became the 5th all vote-by-mail state along with Oregon, Washington, Colorado, and Utah. California, Nevada, and Vermont will also be all vote-by-mail starting in 2022.
- In 2021, automatic voter registration was adopted.
- In 2022, Common Cause Hawaii is working to pass ranked choice voting.
